Preventing Plagiarism: How to Help Your Students, ULIB 3D

Internet-based resources - either of the legitimate library database variety or the less-savory Wikipedia variety - have made it significantly easier for students to plagiarize. Some people see plagiarism as evidence of moral bankruptcy or intellectual laziness. Though one cannot discount those two motivations, the reality is that most students plagiarize because they don't know what plagiarism is. In some cases, it appears that even faculty and instructors are unclear about what qualifies as plagiarism. This presentation will describe four types of plagiarism, methods which may be employed to help students avoid plagiarism, and services the Library has to offer to faculty and students with regard to academic integrity.
