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Student Council Approves Faculty Proposals for Better Conditions

Startling improvements suggested by the N.J.C. faculty have been adopted, according to President Dean "Danny Boy" McDuff. These will be added soon to the already nearly perfect regulations which now govern the inmates of the beloved institution.

Faculty members, believing that a few changes would boost lagging student morale and bring about more cooperation in campus activities as a whole, presented these suggestions to the Council at a meeting on April 26 in their exclusive club room at the Middleway. Besides President "Danny Boy" McDuff, Yvonne "Luscious" Lusk, Charles David "Blabber Mouth" Golsen, Virginia "I'm Timid" Crawford, Hugh "I Love Me Truly" Powell, John "Bubbles" Traylor, Frank "Hup-Three-Four" Cline, and Jo Layne "Wolverine" Jarrell were reluctant to pass these drastic measures because they feared that the student body would object, but after a little gentle (?) persuasion from the faculty members, they voted unanimously for the proposals.

Building Program Will Feature Bar

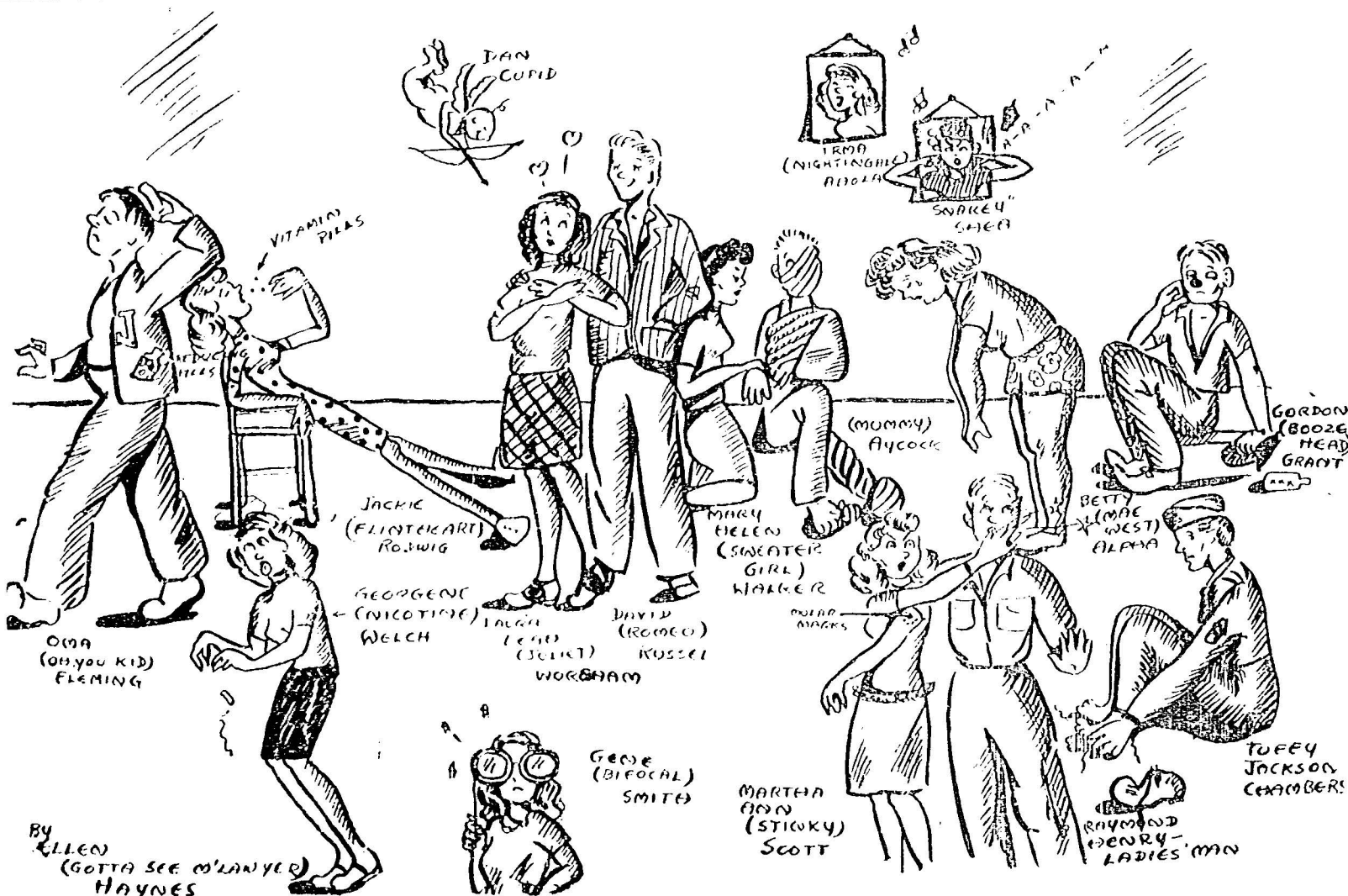
